The WZB Berlin Social Science Center, research area International Politics and Law, research unit **Global Governance** (Director: Prof. Dr. Michael Zürn), is seeking

### **three student assistants (f/m/x)**

to be employed from 1<sup>st</sup> October 2019 for a period of 12 months, with possibility of extension and a weekly workload of 10 hours.

Two of the positions are intended for the project 'Towards a Typology of Contestations', which operates within the Cluster of Excellence 'Contestations of the Liberal Script' (SCRIPTS), and one for the 'Theory Network' of SCRIPTS ([www.scripts.eu](http://www.scripts.eu)).

### **Tasks**

- Support of scientific work, such as literature research, data collection and processing, providing content-related input for publications, as well as editorial work.

### **Necessary qualifications**

- Bachelor's or Master's student in International Relations, Political Science, Sociology, or a related discipline,
- Very good course achievements,
- Very good command of written and spoken English,
- Sound knowledge of MS Office applications,
- Experience with, or interest in, data collection, processing, and management (e.g., in Excel, STATA, R, or SPSS).

- Knowledge of theories of International Relations, more specifically of Comparative Politics or Political Theory,
- Knowledge of quantitative and qualitative research methods,
