A New Home for SCRIPTS

Since September 1, the Berlin Graduate School for Global and Transregional Studies (BGTS) has moved into its new building at Schwendener Straße 8 — a central hub for exchange, collaboration, and graduate training within SCRIPT. By March 2026, all SCRIPTS units will have moved into their new buildings.

Recognition for SCRIPTS Researchers

Once again, this year, SCRIPTS scholars have achieved excellent results in Berlin's Top 100 Scientists 2025 ranking. Our Principal Investigators Tanja A. Börzel and Gülay Çağlar, along with alumna Martyna Linartas, were included in this year's list — adding to a growing number of SCRIPTS researchers recognized for outstanding academic achievements.

The PALS Data Navigator is online. Developed by the *Public Attitudes* towards the Liberal Script (PALS) project, this interactive tool makes data from an international survey of more than 60,000 respondents in 30 countries publicly available. As SCRIPTS transitions toward its second funding phase, the cluster continues to foster academic exchange. In late November, the conference "Contestations of the Liberal Script in Regional Organizations", organized by Diana Panke, Alexander Libman, and Tanja A. Börzel, will bring together international experts to discuss how regional organizations respond to liberal contestations.

In December, a farewell conference will honor Thomas Risse and reflect on his lasting contributions to research on international cooperation and democracy.

Both events serve to consolidate insights from the first funding phase and set the stage for future research.
